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Paired State - Nagaland - An Introduction

Nagaland, state of India, lying in the hills and mountains of the



northeastern part of the country. It is one of the smaller states of India. Nagaland is bounded by the Indian states of Arunachal Pradesh to the northeast, Manipur to south, and Assam to the west and northwest and the country of Myanmar (Burma) to the east. The state capital is Kohima.

Nagaland has monsoonal a (wet-dry) climate. Annual rainfall averages between 70 and 100 inches Average temperatures decrease with greater elevation; in the

summer temperatures range from the low about 21–23 °C to the low about

38–40 °C. While in the winter they rarely drop below 4 °C. Forests cover about one-sixth of Nagaland are tropical and subtropical forests, evergreen containing palms, rattan, and bamboo, as well as timber species. valuable



Elephants, tigers, leopards, bears, several kinds of monkeys, sambar deer, buffalo, wild oxen, and the occasional rhinoceros live in the lower hills.

The Nagas, Indoan Asiatic people, form more than 20 tribes, as well as numerous subtribes, and each one has a specific distribution. geographic The Konyaks the are largest tribe, followed by the Aos. Tangkhuls, Semas. and Angamis.



Other tribes include the Lothas, Sangtams, Phoms, Changs, Khiemnungams, Yimchungres, Zeliangs, Chakhesangs (Chokri), and





The Naga tribes lack a common language; there are about 60 spoken dialects, all belonging to the Sino-Tibetan language family. In some areas dialects vary even from village to village. Many Nagas speak Hindi and English. English is the official language of the state.

Nagaland is a rural state. More than four-fifths of the population lives in small isolated villages. The villages are usually divided into *khels*, or

quarters, each with its own headmen and administration. Dimapur and

Kohima are the only urban centre with more than 50,000 people.



harmonium, nickel, cobalt, iron ore, and limestone are found in Nagaland, but only low-grade coal deposits are mined at present. Power generation depends mainly on diesel plants, though hydroelectric output has increased.

Some of the significant festivals for each major tribe are: Sekrenyi Moatsu, Tsungremong Tsukhenyie, Sekrenyi Kundanglem, Lem Bushu Jiba, Miu Festival, Tsokum

In 1967, the Nagaland Assembly proclaimed Indian English as the official language of Nagaland and it is the medium for education in Nagaland. Other than English, Nagamese, a creole Language based on Assamese, is

4. Bhasha Sangam — In this segment the students were given exposure to the alphabet, proverb, and somesentences in the language of the partnering state every week on Monday in the morning assembly.

In 1967, the Nagaland Assembly proclaimed Indian English as the official



language of Nagaland and it is the medium for education other than English, Nagamese, a creole language based on Assamese, is widely spoken. It is **Nagamese** which rules the roots across the state.

Nagamese Creole is a creole based on Assamese, Hindi, English and Naga languages. Nagamese is used as a lingua franca in schools, markets, hospitals, the legislative assembly and churches by the

peoples of Nagaland, who speak more than 20 other mutually unintelligible languages. Nagamese stablised as a creole in about 1936.







